For example, CLONTARF, Little Tracks, orientation days.	Whole school

	Growing Strong Minds	This is a P-6 program based on character strengths that strives to empower students to thrive. Strong Minds enhances the school's wellbeing culture by promoting inclusion, a sense of belonging and enhances positive relationships which impacts student engagement and builds resilience. Strong Minds also promotes collaboration with families.	Whole school
	Trauma Informed Practice (TIP)	TIP builds trust promotes safety and builds collaboration, choice, and empowerment. This involves Zones of Regulation, brain breaks, Fantastic Elastic Brain (a growth mindset)	Whole school

Smiling Minds	Smiling Minds is a program used to assist self-regulation and improve focus on learning often used during transition times.	Whole school

Monitor the impact of support for individual students through data collection. Provide consistent strategies and adjustments outlined within an individual student support plan.
